This document is intended to be an adjunct to the pages on the web site about the area around Barbican.

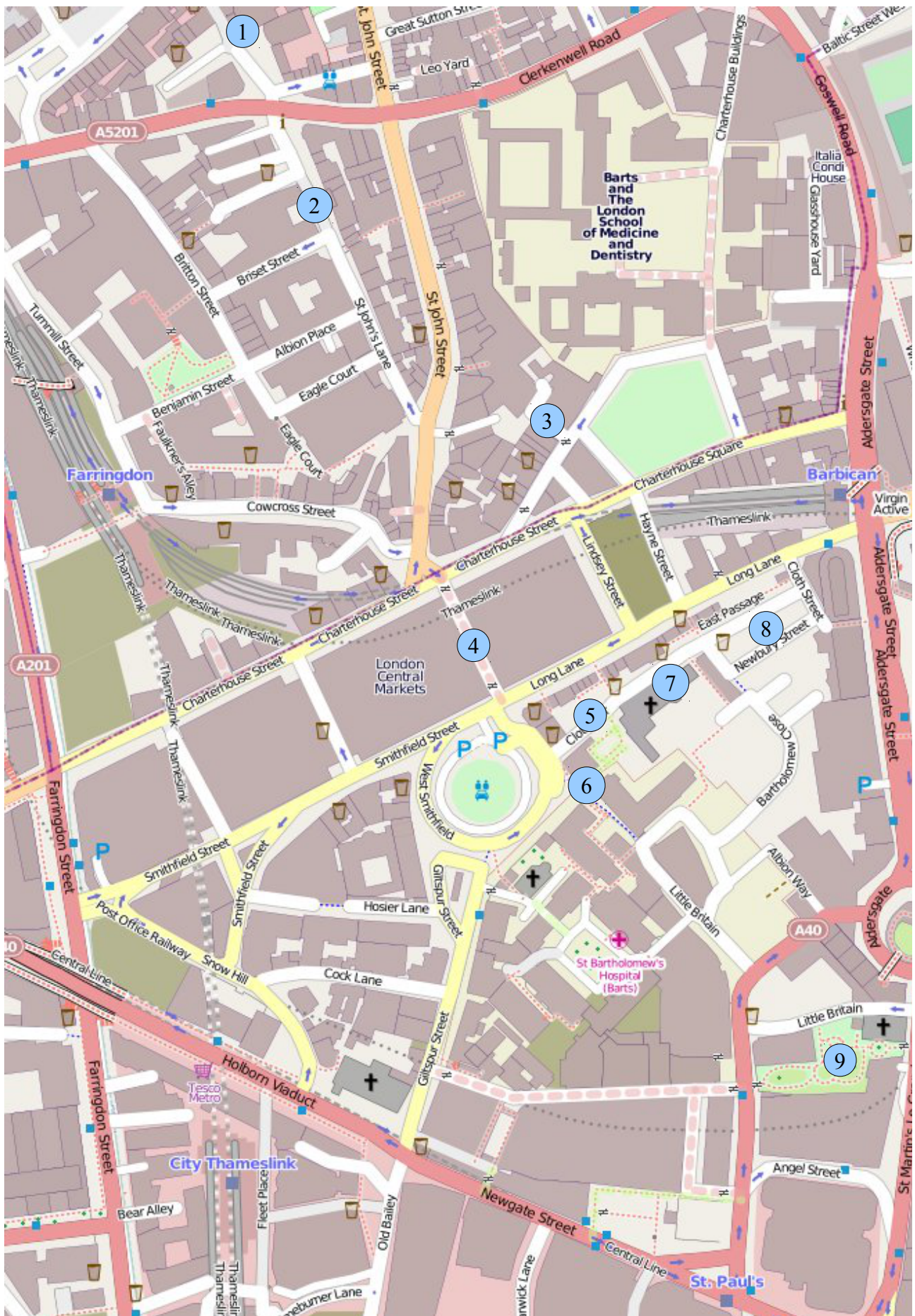
The numbers on the maps are not intended to give an order of visiting but just to enable labelling. You decide on your own route. Underground stations are labelled in blue lettering and station entrances are marked with a blue square somewhere near the title. For example – on the first map just above and to the right of the figure 8 is the label for 'Barbican' station with the blue block marking the entrance just below the title.

The second and third maps are the continuation of the first map from its right-hand edge and they overlap a little. You could tape them together if you wish.

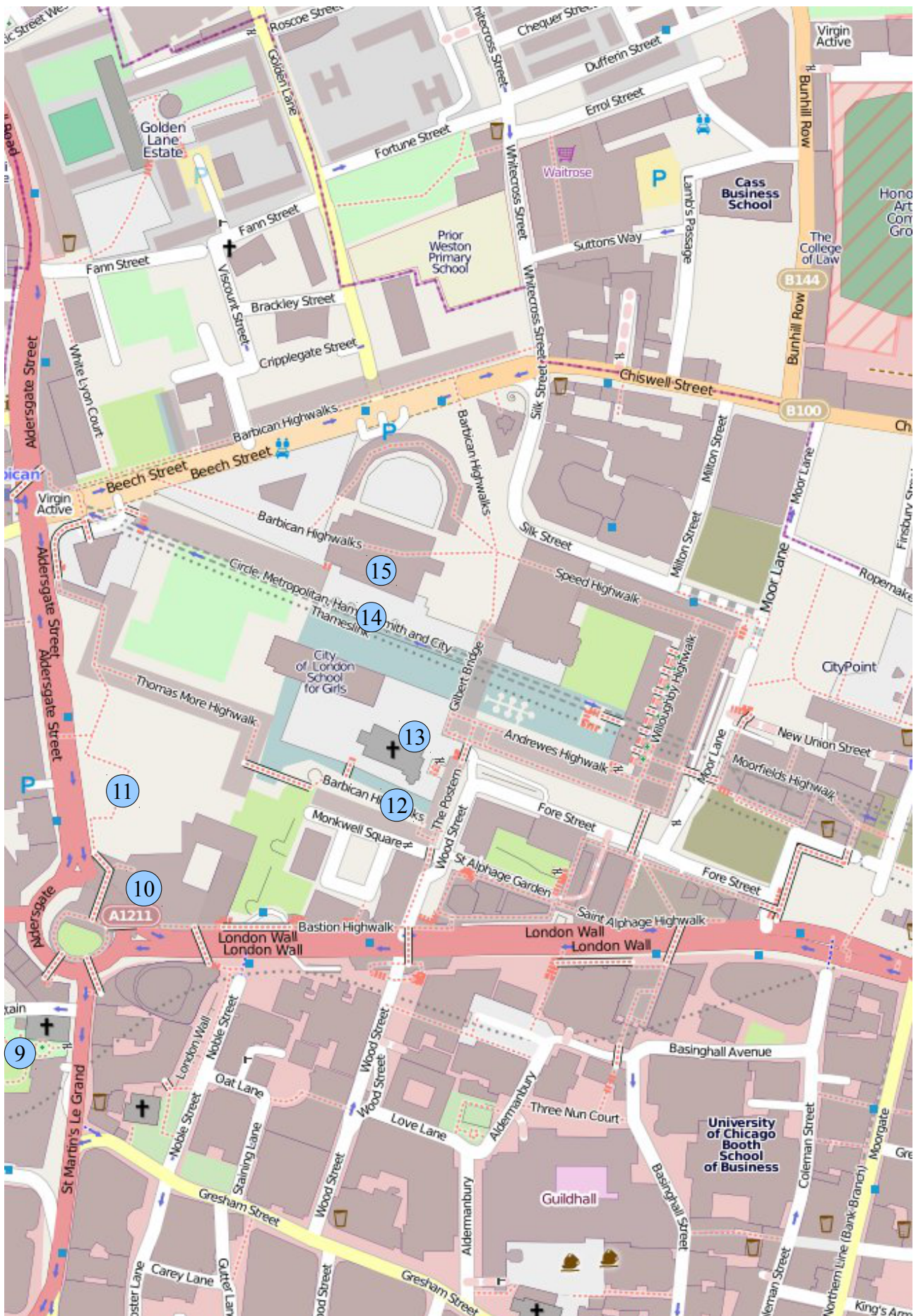
Key to the labels:

1. 12th century crypt, part of the Priory Church of St. John.
2. 16th century St. John's Gate.
3. Charterhouse Mews near Charterhouse Square.
4. The avenue through Smithfield Market
5. Cloth Fair and the Tudor house.
6. Tudor Gateway, St. Bartholomew the Great church.
7. The 12th century church of St. Bartholomew the Great.
8. Medieval street layout (the buildings are not medieval).
9. Postmans Park.
10. Museum of London.
11. Ironmongers Hall.
12. Roman Wall.
13. Church of St. Giles without Cripplegate
14. Barbican Arts Centre and terrace.
15. Barbican Conservatory (restricted opening times).
16. Victorian Turkish Bath.
